News From Your Church Council

Thank you to all those who attended the TLC Congregational Meeting on September 26 after the worship service. There were nineteen of us in attendance, with conversation flowing freely. A motion was passed for the Council to proceed with a Constitutional change to eventually reduce the number of Church Council members from nine members to seven, plus the Pastor. Constitutional changes require several formal steps, and this action will allow Council to move the process forward. A Report of Committees and Ministries was shared; this document will also reside on the TLC website for everyone to access. We brainstormed four important questions:

- How are we doing as a Lay-Led Congregation?
- What is Trinity's Vision for Mission in our community?
- Where and how can we join forces with other churches in our area?
- Where do we plan to be as a church in five years?

Answers were shared verbally and also in print. For those who weren't at the meeting, we encourage you to submit your answers to the church office in the weeks ahead, so that all ideas, questions, and concerns can be heard. Watch for more information on this activity in the coming weeks. We agreed that we are a church in transition, and it is exciting to anticipate how God will use each of us to become active in whatever ways we feel called to serve.

One exciting new path that is opening for Trinity is collaboration with our sister churches in the Mohawk Valley, specifically Zion Lutheran Church in New Hartford and Our Savior Lutheran Church in Utica. An interesting Zoom meeting in September brought together seven of us representing all three churches, and many great resource-sharing opportunities were brainstormed. Another Zoom meeting is scheduled for Sunday afternoon, October 17th at 2:00 for a wider group of people to join the discussion. You are invited to join the Zoom meeting from your home, or meet at TLC where JoAnn Blaise will share the meeting via laptop for all those who would like to join as a group. PRAYER A NOTES:

In talking with God there are many different positions or postures we may use. Each one is a way of coming before God with our whole heart and asking Him to meet us where we are.

- **KNEELING-shows God that we are entering His presence in awe.
- **WALKING-shows God that we are ON THE MOVE for Him in service.
- **BOWING-shows God that we honor Him and feel humble because of who He is.
- **UPLIFTED HANDS-shows God that we are reaching towards Him in Praise and Thanksgiving.
- **PROSTRATE-lying flat on our face or back shows God that we are in awe of Him and are hungry for Him to come and be with us.

May the Holy Spirit guide and direct us to His glory!! YES!!

Covid 19 Protocols

At the August Council meeting, in response to rising Covid 19 infection levels, the TLC Council revised the Covid Policy for the church as follows:

- Unvaccinated individuals must continue to wear a mask at all times.
- When the Herkimer County Infection Rate is Substantial or High, masks are required for all individuals during the Worship Service. (Click here or visit covid.cdc.gov to check the status)
- When the Herkimer County Infection Rate is Low or Moderate, masks are required for vaccinated individuals while singing during worship, or singing anywhere in the church building.

Thank you for continuing to do the following:

- Maintain a comfortable and safe distance between yourself and others
- Stay home if you are not feeling well
- Use good hygiene practices, including use of hand sanitizing stations provided
- Respect one another at all times.

Our Church is following the New York State Department of Health Guidelines as we make decisions for the church and its members. The county rate is measured weekly, and we will share the rate in our Weekly Announcement email. In addition, a sign will be posted on the church door to state the risk level of our county. Masks are available to those who are in need. The Office for the Aging has provided Trinity with a generous supply of masks. If we all follow these guidelines, our church will continue to be a welcoming and safe space, both virtually and physically. Thank you for being a part of Trinity!

The pandemic is affecting each of us differently and in many ways. While we continue to hold each other in prayer, we especially lift up all families who have lost loved ones during this time.
