The Lenten Journey Begins This Month

On Ash Wednesday we begin our forty-day journey toward Easter with a day of fasting and repentance. There will be an Ash Wednesday service on Wednesday, February 22 at Trinity at 3 p.m.. Deacon Patsy Glista will be leading the service and dispensation of communion.

Last year during the season of Lent, we took time to reflect and write down things that we were thankful for in our lives. Things like forgiveness, blessings, baptism, grace and love were recorded and put in a large glass jar in our sanctuary. On different Sundays in Lent during worship, our worship leader would pull out a few slips of paper and share them with the congregation to bring attention to these things that we might take for granted.

This year we will bring out that jar again! This can certainly be done in your own home as well if you are participating in Trinity's services on the internet. Sunday, February 26 will mark the first Sunday in Lent. We invite you to write down something you might give up for Lent. Instead of tangible things like desserts or candy or buying new clothes, think about the things you need to work on to be a better person. Why not try to surrender things such as weakness, fear, jealousy, impatience, criticism, or being motivated by others' judgment? Write it down and put those slips of paper in a bowl or jar and really try to work on improving. That container holding the papers shows that God contains our weaknesses and is much bigger than our own self-limiting thoughts.

Another option is to write down things that you are willing to give up your time for, to help those in need during Lent. Volunteer to cook meals or deliver meals to the homeless and shut-ins. Call an elderly person, send a note or make time to visit. You will make their day! Volunteer to help out at local non-profit organizations that reflect your interests, including churches with their many programs. These are just a few suggestions to give up some of your precious time to help others.

Lent is a season for solitary prayer and attentive listening. Listen to your heart, give of your time and don't give up on your own self-improvement with the help of God.

I am hopeful that I can honor them, as we as a Congregation move forward in 2023 and beyond.

I would like to “bring back” the idea of a Spring & Fall “work day” (or days for each, due to people’s personal schedules). In the past, this was done on a Saturday morning, but could be done at people’s convenience, outdoor & indoor basic cleaning & “spiffing things up.” With Easter being April 9th this year, pray for timely spring weather to allow us to hold at least 1 work day prior to Easter Sunday. Did you know? First Communion training is available to anyone interested; please contact Phillis Becker. Baptism Sacrament is available with a meeting/counseling time first, service at another time with Pastor Gail Wolling. You may contact either Phillis or Pastor Gail to schedule. Confirmation class can be planned, also with Phillis, or off-site with another Lutheran Church if that is your preference. Options for service to others in Jesus’ name include preparing meals for Salvation Army or “Feed My Sheep” distributions. Highway Cleanup will continue also.

I will admit to being taken by surprise at least twice in the past few days, learning of two local Churches in our Valley Villages who have either already closed their congregation’s doors, or plan to close in 2023. We need people to be involved in Worship, activities, and service to others, so it doesn’t happen to us.

Also, on a side note, we are looking ahead to the June Congregational Meeting for possible speech-to-text, or typing comments so they can be read in real-time, to assist those who are hard-of-hearing especially in a meeting situation.

I am thankful for support from Council & Congregation Members, and our Staff!

Trinity Lutheran Church Covid 19 Protocols Updated July 13, 2022

Using the NYS Department of Health Guidelines and Herkimer County data, the TLC Church Council has set the following expectations in place for anyone using the church facilities. This includes worship, meetings, and all other purposes. Council discusses this issue monthly at their meetings.

When the County COVID-19 Community Level is **High**:

- All persons will wear a mask at all times, except when taking Communion, or in the Fellowship Hall & seated/consuming food. Masks must be worn correctly.
- Sign in on the chart when you enter the church, at the bottom of the stairs.
- Maintain a comfortable and safe distance between yourself and others (six feet).
- Stay home if you are not feeling well or have any symptoms of illness.
- Use good hygiene practices, including use of the hand sanitizing stations provided.
- Respect one another at all times.

When the County COVID-19 Community Level is **Medium or Low**:

- Unvaccinated individuals must wear a mask at all times.
- Sign in on the chart when you enter the church, at the bottom of the stairs.
- Maintain a comfortable and safe distance between yourself and others (six feet).
- Stay home if you are not feeling well or have any symptoms of illness.
- Use good hygiene practices, including use of the hand sanitizing stations provided.
- Respect one another at all times.

The county rate is measured weekly, and we share the rate in our Weekly Announcement email. In addition, a sign is posted on the church door to state the risk level of our county. Masks are available to those who are in need.

If we all follow these guidelines, our church will continue to be a welcoming and safe space, both virtually and physically. Thank you for being a part of Trinity!
