PRAYER IS LIFE'S COMPASS:

When our prayers are focused, regardless of what life throws at us, whether it's a long, hard climb to the top of our profession or career, or the steady trail of perseverance as we set out to achieve our goals, or the confusion and lost feeling that can envelop us when we find ourselves in a thicket of problems and pressure and pain---if our prayers are focused on the living God, they will make a difference, in us, and in our circumstances. In others, in our church, in our nation and in our world.

Focusing on God as our True North helps us see beyond our temporary circumstances here on earth and reminds us of His unchanging character as well. Beginning every prayer with worship, centering down on Jesus to whom we're speaking is awesome for building a close relationship with our Lord. A suggestion, as we begin to pray, is to focus on Psalm 86:12 with an open heart of thankfulness.
