Council Update

Due to a Council seat being vacated by Kylene Jordan, the Council has appointed Wendy Catera to fill the vacancy until the Annual Meeting in January 2024, when there will be an election to fill the seat for the remainder of the term. Thank you to Wendy for agreeing to be on Council until January!

Did you Know?

That our congregation raised \$660 for the "Bee" Generous fund for World Hunger. Our delegates Judy Sadlon and Cathy Mayton Collins took the donation with them to submit at the Synod Assembly in June. Our donation was enough to fund three community gardens and three bee hives. The Synod in total collected over \$23,000 for this very worthwhile cause!

June Congregational Meeting

The annual June "Ministries and Reports" Congregational Meeting was held on Sunday, June 11th. Reports on the ministries of the church were offered, and active discussion occurred among the 21 congregation members who attended. Council President Amy Manning alerted those in attendance that the parsonage roof needs to be replaced; quotes from qualified and insured contractors will be sought. The importance of having a bonded contractor to do the work was stressed. Quotes will be gathered and a vote by the congregation will be needed at a future meeting. It was announced that a joint picnic for our three area Lutheran churches will again be held on Sunday, August 27th at the Frankfort Marina. Save the date and plan to attend! Amy reminded everyone that there will be openings to be filled on both Council and the Endowment Committee in January, and encouraged each person to find a way to become involved in the life of the church. The meeting closed with a Courtesy Resolution and a group sharing of the Lord's Prayer.

Restorative Justice: Beliefs and Action Steps

What makes us Lutheran? And how do our actions match our beliefs? At all levels of the Lutheran Church conversations about "Restorative Justice" are taking place. As Lutherans, we believe that Christ's church is for **all** people. God calls and claims each of us by name, and it is not our job to sort, divide, categorize or exclude. Churches everywhere are examining policies and practices around the ideas of "Restorative Justice". The TLC Council has begun a conversation about the issue of "Land Acknowledgement" and how that may impact the relationship between our church and the Native American community of our area. How does the following statement sound to you?

Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church is located on the original and ancestral homelands of the Mohawk and Oneida Nations of the Haudenosaunee peoples, and we give thanks for their presence here since time immemorial. We also wish to recognize and honor all our Indigenous siblings who have, and continue to call this land their home.

Your Council will continue their discussion about adding this and possible other statements to help define the future of TLC. Talk to any Council member and add your voice to the discussion.

Worship, Music, and Prayer

BLESSINGS OF PRAYER:

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say rejoice!! Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your request be made known to God." Philippians 4:4,6

PRAYER NOTES: As we stand firm, unmovable and unshakeable In our position as children of God,

We are to put on:

The Belt of TRUTH —The FIRST piece of equipment that a Roman soldier put on was his belt, because every other piece connected to it. Our invisible armor consists first and foremost of the Belt of TRUTH which is GOD'S WORD.

The Breastplate of RIGHTEOUSNESS — This was the piece of armor that covered the soldier's heart and his vital organs. The breastplate of our invisible armor is RIGHTEOUSNESS. Right living. A clean conscience. We need to make sure we are right with GOD and others. Our own spiritual health and well-being depends on it.

Our feet fitted with the readiness that comes with the GOSPEL of PEACE—soldiers' sandals had cleats on them, so that when in battle they could get a firm footing and were less likely to slip and fall. Stand firm on the GOSPEL, the GOOD NEWS. That's where real PEACE is found.

The Shield of FAITH---This was the piece of equipment that was as large as the soldier. And it was only effective if the soldier stayed close behind it. Our invisible shield of FAITH is our total dependence upon GOD. Our trust in JESUS. Just stay close to it.

The Helmet of SALVATION---This piece of armor covered the soldier's head. His thoughts. Reasoning. For us, we are to be assured, without any doubt, that God has forgiven us and that we have received life through FAITH in JESUS CHRIST. Put On your helmet of SALVATION!

The sword of the SPIRIT. —Paul tells us clearly what the sword is when he says it "is the WORD of GOD". We are to read, study, apply, and live by God's Word, confident that His Word holds the answers to life's questions and gives us principles to live by. It is the written Word of God that reveals the Living Word of God, drawing people to the Light, to the Truth.....to Jesus. Wield your sword with the power of God's Spirit, but always wrap it in love. That is God's Love, YES!!

Now begin to really PRAY. For a soldier, this would involve his direct communication with his commander. For us as children of God, our commander is JESUS CHRIST. We communicate with HIM through prayer. It's super special because it's a Personal Relationship, an open dialogue, with OUR GOD. WOW, amazing isn't it, so climb aboard, there's plenty of room for ALL!!!
