It has been a busy summer, both within our Congregation, on the homefront, and at my job. I would like to bring you "up to date" on a few items.

The joint task force, called the "Trinity-Zion Think Tank," has come to the conclusion that our 2 Individual Congregations are compatible enough to start the Call process, to share 1 Pastor to serve our 2 Congregations. Our Council is forming a new Task Force to actually prepare & submit the official document, called the Ministry Site Profile, or "MSP," which the survey earlier this year was paraphrased from. Please look for announcements for a potential special Congregational meeting to discuss & vote on matters, as this will mean a financial commitment to financially support approximately 50% of a Pastor's salary & benefit package. My own opinion is that we should move forward with this.

I want to thank those who have pitched in to do extra chores around our building & grounds while our Sexton, Paul, is recovering from a Bicycle accident. Please check in with a Council Member to see if there is something you could do to help out, such as take out the trash & recycling, bring the bins back from the curb after pickup, or something else.

I will be planning an October "Fall Cleanup" day, similar to what we did in the Spring before Easter. There are some areas, such as the Office, which didn't get addressed, general items such as washing windows/screens. Outdoor Leaves could need pickup/putting into green waste bins for their removal.

Please keep yourselves & others safe in the last few official weeks of summer.

Worship, Music, and Prayer

BLESSINGS OF PRAYER:

"In the morning, O Lord, Thou wilt hear my voice; in the morning I will order my prayer to Thee and eagerly watch." (Psalm 5:3)

PRAYER NOTES: PREPARING FOR PRAYER

The most important commitment we ever can make is to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. After all it affects every area of our life, as well as every fiber of our being ----mental, emotional, physical, as well as spiritual. It's a commitment that we continue to live out on a moment-to-moment, day-to-day basis. Our commitment determines the way we spend our money and our time, the friends we have, the habits we establish and the habits we break, where we go and what we do. It's a commitment that has been life-altering and life-shaping.

It's not easy. It requires time. Energy. Sacrifice. It involves reading God's Word and pleading God's promises. It's motivated by a wholehearted Love, Faith and Trust that's willing to suffer, to repent, to sacrifice.

Our commitment to pray just doesn't happen. It requires preparation. Setting aside a refuge, a particular place for prayer where we would be undistracted and undisturbed. We all need this kind of sacred space set aside for special time alone with Jesus Christ our Lord. WOW!!!!

Prayer helps us anchor our faith in God. It's like setting our spiritual compass so that regardless of the twists and turns during the day, the needle of our focused faith always turns to God.

Food for thought: Why would we tune our instrument AFTER it's been played? With the same reasoning, we need to begin our day with prayer to ensure we live in sync with God. Why would we spend time only in evening prayer after we have already stumbled through the day? While it's wonderful to end our day in prayer, think about praying in the morning when the day before us has a clean slate -----a blank page that has yet to be lived out.

Be aware that again and again, a morning time of prayer is referred to in the Bible. Just in the Psalms alone there are repeated references: Psalm 5:3, 59:16, 88:13, 119:147, 143:8.

Read Mark 1:35 where he reveals that Jesus Himself, after a pressure -packed day of intense ministry, "Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where He prayed."

However, we all know we need the regular disciplined prayer of others. For example being part of a prayer team or prayer chain or simply a prayer partner. Prayerfully consider joining Trinity's prayer chain, you and others will be blessed! YES, WHAT AN AWESOME GOD WE SERVE!!
