

Reflection for the Day:

Communion Is Our Strength

(This is an excerpt from a Temple Talk given by member Joanne Killenbeck several years ago.)

My journey of Faith started as an infant when I was placed into the "Cradle Roll" of the Trinity Lutheran Church in Berwick, PA, My earliest memories are how my father held my hand during church and gently stroked the back of it with his thumb, which was very comforting and almost hypnotic so it kept me quiet and at least gave me the opportunity to listen to God's Word and try to understand.

...(After a number of years), I married Robert Wilson and we joined a Presbyterian church. A year and a half later we were blessed with the birth of our amazing daughter. I remained a member for approximately 12 years. I'm sorry to say that the last several of those years I did not attend regularly because I became depressed over personal problems and felt lost and alienated.

As time passed, I again suffered depression and felt I was unworthy to ask for God's help when others had "serious" problems He needed to address. So I again did not attend services on a regular basis. Depression is difficult to explain to those who have never experienced it; but in my case, it robbed me of sleep, energy and the ability to think clearly and make decisions. I often used the expression "I can't see the forest for the trees". Ironically, I read something recently that would have been a much more helpful thought about trees and perhaps would have helped send me back to church and end my self-made isolation. It was written by Charles Spurgeon and says the following:

"COMMUNION is STRENGTH and SOLITUDE is WEAKNESS. Alone, the fine old beech yields to the blast and lies prone in the meadow. In the forest, SUPPORTING each other, the trees LAUGH at the hurricane".

To clarify my feelings during that time, I assure you that I never lost my Faith!!! I simply felt that I was unworthy to ask for help and thought I should, as the old saying goes, "pull myself up by my bootstraps", but I seemed unable to do that. However, I continued supporting the church financially and tried (with both professional help and that of my family and friends) to address the issues that seemed to be pulling me "down" and fought to regain my confidence and self- esteem so that I could again be useful to others, with God's help. It was a long, hard road but I came to know that the Lord had not abandoned me, even though it seemed as though I had abandoned HIM!

In conclusion, when I made the decision to move here in 2004, I was anxious to again get back to my Lutheran roots. Being a member here has been a BLESSING for me and A LOT of the credit goes to all of you in the congregation and Pastor Ann Zimmerman for making me feel so welcome. I sincerely thank you for that, and I look forward to relearning things I've forgotten and strengthening my Faith. THANK YOU. Joanne
