BLESSINGS OF PRAYER:

"I love the Lord, for He heard my voice; He heard my cry for mercy. Because He turned His ear to me, I will call on Him as long as I live.". (Psalm 116:1,2)

PRAYER NOTES:

What happens when we worship God in our darkest moments???

Instructions to Praise God, in all situations, are everywhere in the Bible. They aren't just nice isolated suggestions for certain kinds of prayer. Those who wrote many of the psalms did not pray in a protective environment. In fact, their circumstances were often much more exhausting than ours. But somehow they managed to turn their eyes from the visual situation of the world to the invisible God, and what began with distress ended with saturated Prayer. And nowhere along the way did they completely lose heart and quit praying.

The Praise we offer when our desperate prayers remain unanswered is far more precious to God than the Praise we offer when all is well. He loves it all, of course, but when our worship is a deep painful sacrifice, it smells much sweeter to Him.

Prayer.....it sounds so important, so intimidating, so religious. But it doesn't have to. Prayer isn't just something we do -- it's WHO WE ARE. "Every sound we utter, every thank you we say, every tear we cry in God's presence is Prayer."

Discover intimacy with a God that loves us as we are. And since He loves us as we are, we can talk to Him as we are.

What a friend we have in Jesus. What a privilege to carry, everything to God in prayer.
