Council President's Musings

Time continues to fly, and I find it hard to believe, but we on the council are preparing for Advent, Christmas, and the January Annual Meeting. Council received a resignation letter from our Administrative Assistant, Tina Diehl, effective 12/02/2024. Join us for worship on December 1st to wish her well!

The Stewardship & Finance Committee has prepared a Proposed Budget for the new Fiscal Year beginning 02/01/2025. Council has reviewed the initial plan, made a minor change, & will vote on the budget at the December meeting. When approved by Council, the budget will be up to a Congregational vote at the January Annual Meeting which is scheduled for January 26, 2025. Council & Endowment Committee members will be voted upon.

Current Incumbents, eligible for a 2nd Term, are: <u>Council</u>: JoAnn Blaise, & Judy Sadlon; & <u>Endowment</u> <u>Committee</u>: P.J. Marusic. There is a vacant seat on Council that we would like to fill. Formerly, it was Ann Maher's seat, with 1 year remaining in her Term.

There is activity in our Call Committee, and I will use the cliche: "the ball is rolling."

I am pleased we are continuing to plan Fellowship events with Our Saviour, Utica, & Zion, New Hartford, and hope to see this continue, including a Carol Sing-Along on December 8th at Our Saviour, Utica at 2:00pm, with a coffee/snack time afterward. Also, Our Saviour has invited all to their Tuesday midweek Advent Worship services, on 12/3, 12/10 & 12/17 with potluck at 6pm and worship at 7pm. If you come to the potluck please bring a dish of food to share.

The Annual meeting will be Sunday, January 26, 2025, at 11:30am/after Worship. This meeting is to approve the Budget for the new Fiscal year starting 2/1/2025 through 1/31/2026, as well as voting on eligible new terms for Council & Endowment Committee members. We will be developing the list of Voting members as per Constitution rules, Confirmed members who have donated at least \$0.01 in their name to Trinity, & have taken Communion in the past year. If we have a "snow day" on January 26th, we will change to a Zoom meeting beginning at 11am.

Also, I anticipate we will participate in the "Tackle Hunger" food-raising campaign, the Souperbowl of Caring, in January & February, with a major focus on Superbowl Sunday, 2/09/2025. More details to follow in the future Tidings editions.

Advent Worship

We are in the midst of setting aside time to prepare for the celebration of Jesus' birth and the anticipation of his return. Let us come together and celebrate the season during worship.

The first Sunday in Advent, December 1, we will celebrate the long tradition of the lighting of the first candle on the Advent wreath. Immediately following service, there will be the "Hanging of the Greens". This is a time of fellowship to decorate the tree and church for the Advent and Christmas season. All hands are welcome to join in!

The second Sunday in Advent, December 8, is a communion service with the blessing of the lighting of the Christmas tree and the second Advent candle is lit.

The third Sunday of Advent, December 15, is a regular service, with the continuation of the lighting of the Advent candles and joyous singing of Advent hymns.

The fourth Sunday in Advent, December 22, the lighting of the last Advent candle and a special program by the Faith Alive participants.

Tuesday, December 24, there will be a new Christmas candlelight service at 3 p.m. with communion. It includes your favorite Christmas carols and scripture readings and a beautiful anthem from the church choir (Christmas Lullaby of Joy).

Sunday, December 29, is a new Christmas Lessons and Carols worship service with reflections from Martin Luther. It includes lots of opportunities for singing your favorite Christmas hymns and participation from the congregation to read bible verses. The celebration of Jesus' birth continues!

Advent is for Ambulances

Many people in Zimbabwe do not have vehicles of their own to transport another person, and hospitals are often miles away. Ambulances are not provided the way they are in the United States by public infrastructure. The church has been operating ambulance service for decades and their ambulances are about to break down permanently. It is literally a matter of life and death. Throughout Advent we can join our fellow upstate congregations in the Bishop's Advent giving challenges for ambulances for Zimbabwe. The goal is 4 ambulances at \$40,000 each. Please mark on your envelope "Advent for Ambulances". All donations must be received by December 29th.

Christmas gifts for residents of LutheranCare will be gathered until December 5th. This "wish list" includes: Personal care items such as unopened boxes of tissue, lotion & bath gel, jewelry, afghans, throws & comforters, Ballerina slippers, moccasins, slipper socks with gripper bottoms, wall & room decorations, robes, button-down or zipper-front sweaters both male & female. Oplatki

The tradition of the Oplatki originated in Poland during Early Christian times. It began with a simple white wafer, baked from flour and water. The wafers are wonderfully designed to display Christmas images, such as the Nativity. The tradition is popular throughout eastern Europe, including Lithuania and Slovakia. The wafers stay fresh for a long time. It is safe to store them for several months, preferably in a sealed container. Worship, Music, and Prayer

BLESSINGS OF PRAYER:

"And on that day shall you say, PRAISE THE LORD, CALL UPON HIS NAME, DECLARE HIS DOINGS AMONG THE PEOPLE, make mention that HIS NAME IS EXALTED.*

PRAYER NOTES:

There are four particulars in this verse which will greatly benefit our spiritual walk. They are:

PRAISE THE LORD

When we "Praise the Lord" we are praising Him for a task that is already done, a victory that has already been won, and a Salvation that has already been secured. It was done at the Cross! We truly have so much for which to PRAISE HIM; we have no grounds whatsoever for complaints.

CALL UPON HIS NAME

This statement actually speaks of prayer, which should be done, at least in a sense, without ceasing. (1 Thessalonians 5:17). Many Christians, unfortunately, do not avail themselves of the great and glorious opportunity to "call upon His Name" in prayer. Those who do experience the constant JOY which come to those who have a close relationship with Jesus. We should, we must, " Call upon His Name".

DECLARE HIS DOINGS AMONG THE PEOPLE:

We should constantly be witnessing, testifying, and by every method possible, "declaring His doings among the people," and in such a way that the people will always know how good GOD really is.

EXALT HIS NAME "

This proclaims the fact that the Name of Jesus must be exalted above every name, because HE is the One Who has paid the price for our Redemption. Out of all the Names that are applied to Him in the Bible, the greatest Name is "Jesus." This Name means "Saviour," and as such, is the culmination of what all the other Names, as important as they are, lead up to (Matthew 1:21).

"And she shall bring forth a Son, and you shall call His Name JESUS (Saviour) for He shall save His people from their sins".
