Disciples of Jesus Christ called to bring God's light into the world: through worship, serving, learning and sharing the Good News!

I was making a mental list about what people used to do while waiting before SmartPhones were invented. It included:

- 2. Read the newspaper we had tucked under our arm
- 3. Whistle / wish we could whistle / wonder how people whistled.

This led me to imagining Jesus, in the tomb, waiting to rise. Did he rise early, then realize he could lie there another hour and still be out before the women came? Maybe he rose much like I rise from sleep, except of course, he was dead rather than sleeping. Which is a fairly big difference. Still...

He sits up slowly. Lays back down. Dreams a little longer.

Opens his eyes. Blinks, letting his eyes adjust to the dark.

Sits up. Stretches his arms above his head. Groans.

Remembers he is out of milk. And cereal. And a bowl, a spoon, a kitchen.

Stumbles to the entrance of the tomb, hand on the stone wall, groping for the light switch.

Makes a note to himself, "inspire someone to invent a light-switch."

Grabbing a stick, he makes a To Do list on the wall, including things he has already done just for the sense of accomplishment.

- 1. Rise from the dead
- 2. Move stone
- 3. Surprise Mary:)
- 4. Go to Galilee
- 5. Surprise, like, everyone, ever

He bends his right ear to his shoulder. Then his left. Hears his neck crack.

He puts his right hand on the wall fingertips only, the hole in his hand still tender, he pulls it back, looks at the fresh scar, runs his thumb across it gently. Makes a fist, just because he can.

Clasps his hands together. Drops his chin, takes a moment to pray: Father, grant me the strength to move that big-ass stone. He thinks, "how's this for some truth, Pilate?" And throws his full weight against the stone.

It falls away easily.

Pulling himself up and through the doorway, into the semi-darkness of just-before-dawn, he inhales the cool morning air. Walks a few steps, then filled with a sense of mission, breaks into a light jog. He passes a couple of women on the road. They, so bent in sorrow, neither see, nor hear him...Whistling.

BLESSINGS OF PRAYER:

"Give ear to my words, O Lord, consider my groaning. Heed the sound of my cry for help, my King and my God. For to Thee do I pray. In the morning, O Lord Thou will hear my voice; in the morning I will order my prayer to Thee and eagerly watch." (Psalm 5:1-3)

PRAYER NOTES:

The powerful words of Martin Luther:. "Tomorrow I plan to work, from early until late. In fact, I have so much to do that I spend the first three hours in prayer."

Did you know that Psalm 46:1 "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble", inspired Martin Luther to write the great hymn,

"A MIGHTY FORTRESS IS OUR GOD." Consider praying this Psalm every day, allowing the Holy Spirit to bring to light new and marvelous things. And as HE leads, share them with each other! Always remember that Jesus receives us just as we are and accepts our prayers just as they are. In the same way a child cannot draw a bad picture, a child of God cannot offer a bad prayer.

PRAYER is an attitude of total dependence on God. "I can't do it but God can help me do it." We learn to lean on and trust Jesus throughout the waking moments of every day for help. Our whole life, when it is lived to the Glory of God, is a form of prayer. Take time to pray and learn to lean on God for everything!!

God is my caretaker, all my needs are met.

God gives me the most beautiful place to rest. He nourishes me.

He illuminates my way for HIS GLORY!

Even though I stumble and fall, and the world closes in, I trust in You.
